


Our week at a glance... for Walkers

<p><u>This Week's Theme:</u></p> <p>Dr. Seuss</p>	<p><u>Art Project:</u></p> <p>Left Foot, Right Foot Craft Finger Paint the Fishbowl from <i>The Cat in the Hat</i> Thing 1 & Thing 2 Handprint Art</p> 
<p><u>Play and Discovery:</u></p> <p>Baby's First Books (3 months & up) Even the youngest babies enjoy spending time snuggling and looking at books.</p> <p>Eyes, Nose, Mouth, Toes (3 months & up) Touch your little one's face and say "face." Then place your little one's hand on your face and repeat "face." Caregiver may continue with other words such as eyes, nose, mouth, legs, tummy, feet, and toes.</p> <p>Hats On! (12months & up) Trying on hats and talking about the hats that you are wearing helps expose him or her to new words.</p>	<p><u>Large or Fine Muscle Stimulation:</u></p> <p>Where's the scarf? Trick (6 months & up) Place a scarf through a cardboard tube & play peek-a-boo!</p> <p>Tunnel Time (12 months & up) Crawling through a tunnel is fun!</p> <p>Pass the Ball (12 months & up) Gentle roll a ball to the child and encourage him or her to roll it back to you. This activity promotes body awareness, coordination, and gross motor skills.</p>
<p><u>Sign Language:</u></p>  <p>walk</p> <p>cat</p> <p>fish</p> <p>Baby Sign Language.com</p>	<p><u>Songs, Poems, or Nursery Rhymes:</u></p> <p>"Cat in the Hat" Fingerplay</p> <p>One little cat on a sunny day Put on his hat and went out to play.</p> <p>Two little cats when it started getting dark Put on their hats and went to the park.</p> <p>Three little cats when the sky was blue Put on their hats and went to the zoo.</p> <p>Four little cats by the kitchen door Put on their hats and went to the store.</p> <p>Five little cats on a sunny day Put on their hats and they all ran away</p>
